History. The Madhouses Act 1774 was the first legislation in the United Kingdom addressing mental health. Privately funded lunatic asylums were widely established during the nineteenth century. The County Asylums Act 1808 permitted, but did not compel, Justices of the Peace to provide establishments for the care of "pauper lunatics", so that they could be removed from workhouses and prisons.

Modernists campaigned for increased licensing for mental health institutions (known as 'madhouses') resulting in the Madhouses regulation Act of 1774 (for private madhouses). There continued to be public concern in England about the welfare of those in care, following reports of scandalously low standards in some private madhouses.

As one of the earliest forms of mental health treatment, trephination removed a small part of the skull using an auger, bore or saw. Dated from around 7,000 years ago, this practice was likely used to relieve headaches, mental illness or even the belief of demonic possession. Not much is known about the practice due to lack of evidence.
